Title: INVASIVE SPECIES CONTROL CREW AIDE

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Assist with mapping, monitoring, and control of high-priority invasive species in the Ceded Territories of northeastern Minnesota, northern Wisconsin, and western Michigan. Work as part of a team to manually and chemically remove invasive plants following integrated management principles. Perform hand removal, mechanical removal, and application of herbicides. Safely and effectively mix and apply herbicides to targeted species. Read and follow herbicide labels. Perform periodic maintenance, calibration, troubleshooting, repairing, and inventory of equipment. Collect treatment data in the field using mobile GPS technologies. Participation in safety training and meetings as scheduled. This position may periodically involve 1-2 nights of travel to infestation sites. Must be comfortable working outdoors throughout the summer in uneven terrain and in adverse weather conditions. Travel, lodging, and per diem will be provided.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must possess a valid driver's license and be insurable under GLIFWC's insurance policy.
- Must be physically fit to effectively perform the duties of the position in variable weather conditions and capable of hiking with a 50 lb. backpack sprayer over uneven terrain.
- Must possess a positive attitude.
- Knowledge of invasive species and ability to acquire new plant/animal identification skills.
- Demonstrate skill in understanding oral and written instructions as well as skill in report writing and other written or oral communications.
