DESCRIPTION

The Onji Akiing *From the Earth* Cultural Summer Camp Program is a collaborative effort between the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission and the United States Dept. of Agriculture- Forest Service. The camp centers around the Medicine Wheel, addressing not only the physical but also the emotional, mental and spiritual aspects of adventure-based learning workshops to promote treaty right awareness and practice, strengthen relationships with the outdoors and foster natural resource careers infused with traditional ecological knowledge for youth entering 5-8th grade.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Supervise the safe enforcement of the camp's waterfront rules and approximately 80 camp participants.
- Observe and evaluate camper's abilities on the camper arrival day with a swim test to determine water proficiency. (Observe and evaluate Counselor and Jr. Counselors' abilities with a swim test on orientation/training day)
- Advise counselors of each camper's proficiency in the water.
- Ensure campers who do not pass swim test, NEVER enter the water without a PFD worn properly and securely.
- Provide surveillance during aquatic activities to help prevent and manage injuries
- Utilize rescue methods, first aid and CPR and other emergency management services as needed
- Clean waterfront area daily keeping it free of hazards and debris.
- Enthusiastically participate in the camping experience as a positive example to all campers.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Lifeguard Certification
- CPR/ First Aid certifications
- Valid Driver's License
- Previous experience working with youth preferred
- Knowledge and respect for Native American culture and perspectives

Native American Preference: Indian preference will be applied consistent with GLIFWC policies and the Federal Indian Self Determination and Education Assistance Act (PL 93-638).
