VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

- Position:** Invasive Species Control Aide – 2022 field season
- Department:** Wildlife Section, Biological Services
- Location:** Based in Odanah, WI but duties will require daily travel.
- Closing Date:** April 29, 2022, or until filled
- Classification:** Limited Term Employee, Not to Exceed 19 Weeks (start mid-May)
- Wage:** \$15.00 Per Hour (1-4) Years of Service
\$16.00 Per Hour (5-10) Years of Service
\$17.00 Per Hour (10+) Years of Service

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Specific duties may include, but are not limited to:

- Assist with mapping, monitoring, and control of high-priority invasive species in the Ceded Territories of northeastern Minnesota, northern Wisconsin, and western Michigan.
- Work as part of a team to manually and chemically remove invasive plants following integrated management principles.
- Safely and effectively mix and apply herbicides to targeted species.
- Read and follow herbicide labels.
- Perform periodic maintenance, calibration, troubleshooting, repairing, and inventory of equipment.
- Collect treatment data in the field using mobile GPS technologies.
- Participate in safety training and meetings as scheduled.
- May periodically involve 1-2 nights of travel to control sites in which travel and per diem will be provided.
- Must be comfortable working outdoors throughout the summer in uneven terrain and in adverse weather conditions.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must possess a valid driver's license and be insurable under GLIFWC's insurance policy.
- Must be physically fit to effectively perform the duties of the position in variable weather conditions and capable of hiking with a 50 lb. backpack sprayer over uneven terrain.
- Must possess a positive attitude.
- Knowledge of invasive species and ability to acquire new plant/animal identification skills or a

willingness to learn.

- Demonstrate skill in understanding oral and written instructions as well as skill in following protocols and other written or oral communications.

Native American Preference: Indian preference will be applied consistent with GLIFWC policies and the federal Indian Self Determination and Education Assistance Act (PL 93-638).
