VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

WILDLIFE BIOLOGIST: (Full-time, permanent) Great Lakes Indian Fish & Wildlife Commission (GLIFWC), located on the Bad River Indian Reservation at Odanah, Wisconsin.

The wildlife biologist will join a team of biologists and other scientists in the Biological Services Division (BSD) of GLIFWC working in such diverse fields as fisheries ecology, wildlife ecology, forest ecology and environmental protection. The BSD provides technical advice to 11 Ojibwe tribes in the implementation their treaty-reserved rights in the ceded territories of northern Minnesota, Wisconsin, and Michigan. The BSD strives to infuse Ojibwe culture into its work and to that end employs experts in Traditional Ecological Knowledge. GLIFWC offices are in northern Wisconsin on the Bad River Reservation, along the south shore of Lake Superior.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: Under the supervision of the Wildlife Section Leader, the Wildlife Biologist will:

1. Assist GLIFWC member tribes in the implementation of their treaty-reserved hunting, trapping, and gathering rights in a biologically-sound and culturally appropriate manner.
2. Assist with monitoring and reporting of the harvest of furbearer species for treaty hunting and trapping seasons.
3. Serve as liaison between GLIFWC and other state and federal agencies in relation to ceded territory rights and responsibilities.
4. Serve as one of the experts in the management and research of various furbearer species in the ceded territories and assist in the development of species stewardship plans.
5. Assist tribal leaders and attorneys in negotiation and serve as a wildlife expert when requested.
6. Supervise LTE's and wildlife technicians during field work.
7. Perform other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Master of Science degree in wildlife management, wildlife ecology, natural resources management, or closely related field; or Bachelor of Science degree and at least 5 years of experience in the above fields.
2. Knowledge and experience with the ecology and management of various furbearer species to include wolves, otters, fishers, martens, and bobcats.
3. Demonstrated skill in written and oral communication.
4. Demonstrated skills with GIS and GPS technologies, database software.
5. Demonstrated aptitude or experience in cross-cultural working environment.
6. Experience with statistical analysis and modeling preferred.

7. Experience working with tribal communities preferred.
8. Must have valid driver's license and be insurable.
9. Indian Preference will be applied consistent with GLIFWC policies and the federal Indian Self Determination and Education Assistance Act (PL 93-638).

SALARY: The starting salary range for this position is \$44,337 - \$52,653 depending on qualifications and experience. GLIFWC offers a full range of fringe benefits including health insurance, retirement plan, disability insurance, and life insurance.
