POSITION:

Division of Intergovernmental Affairs (DIA) Intern (1)

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Dates of employment: May 30, 2023 to August 11, 2023
(10 weeks, 400 total hours) Rate of pay is \$15.00 per hour

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Division of Intergovernmental Affairs will be offering an internship involving opportunities for research and writing on treaty rights implementation. The specific topic involved will depend on particular legal or policy issues requiring analysis. (Examples may include analysis of water diversion application requirements under an interstate compact, drafting testimony to a state legislature on pending legislation, or researching and analyzing changes in state law and their potential impacts on treaty harvesting.) Other duties and responsibilities will also include:

1. Completing legal or policy reading, research, and writing projects as assigned by the Division of Intergovernmental Affairs.
2. Attending interjurisdictional management and policy meetings, as they arise.
3. Attending meetings of GLIFWC Board of Commissioners and Voigt Intertribal Task Force.
4. Other duties as assigned

The intern will also participate in GLIFWC orientation and training during the first week of the internship. Other cultural activities scattered throughout the internship include the annual Healing Circle Run and the Mikwendaagoziwag Sandy Lake Ceremony, and others.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be enrolled into a higher education program. Preference will be given to candidates who have completed their second or third year in college.
- Interest in supporting Tribal rights to sovereignty and reserved treaty rights.
- Ability to work with other GLIFWC divisions, tribal representatives, and interns.
- Must possess a valid driver's license and ability to be insurable under GLIFWC policies.
- Native American preference, but all qualified candidates will be considered.
- Must be fully vaccinated, including booster, for Covid-19 and provide proof of vaccinations.
