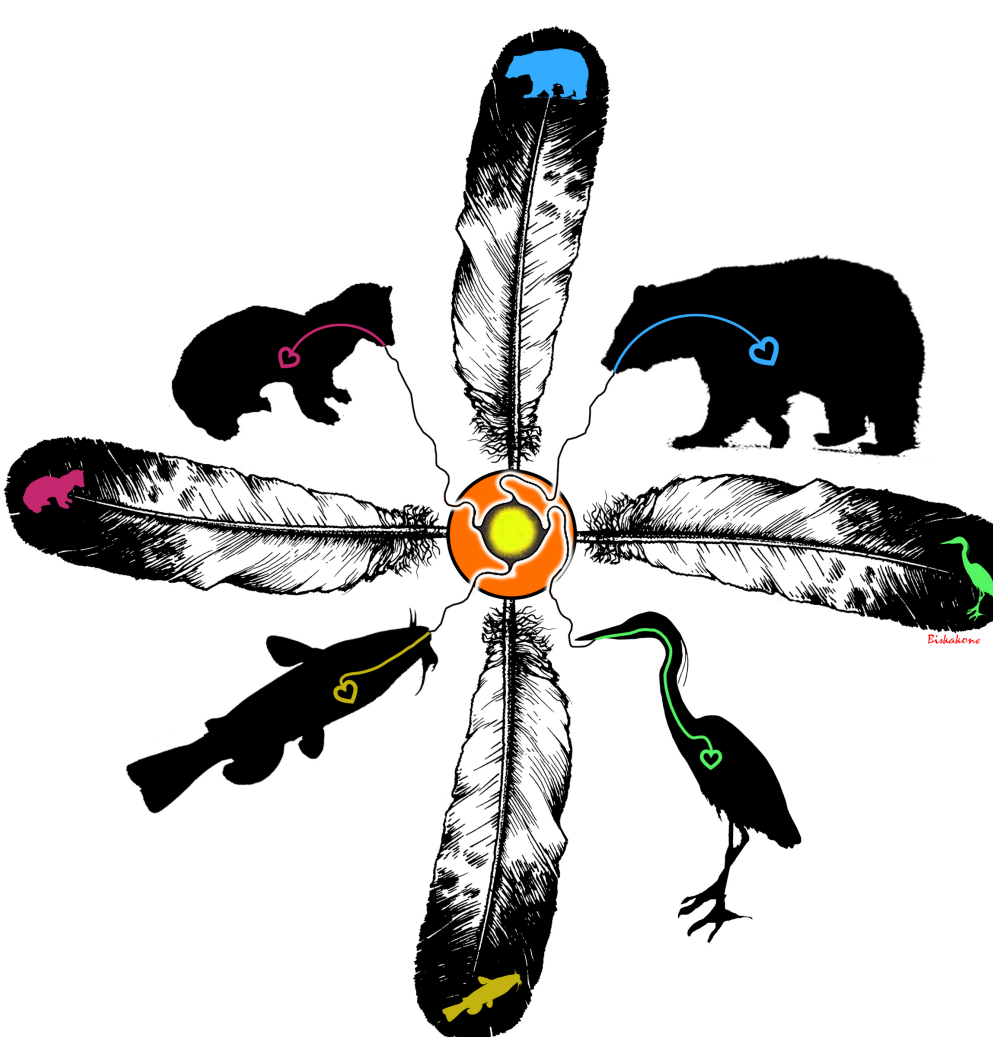

2009: The Year of the Treaty Celebrating GLIFWC's 25th

In recognition of the Great Lakes Indian Fish & Wildlife Commission's (GLIFWC) 25th anniversary, 2009 is being celebrated as the "Year of the Treaty." The artwork above, by Biskakone (Greg Johnson), Lac du Flambeau, was created to symbolize a gathering of various Ojibwe treaty bands for a symposium entitled "Minwaajimo~Telling a Good Story: Preserving Ojibwe Treaty Rights" that is intended to be a treaty celebration and educational event.

Planned for July 28-30, 2009 at the Bad River reservation in Oda-nah, Wisconsin, **Minwaajimo** will be an opportunity to both look back at contemporary Ojibwe treaty history and look forward towards a continued meaningful exercise of treaty-reserved rights. It is open to the general public and will draw on observations of numerous scholars, legal experts, natural resource specialists as well as tribal members involved in the exercise and implementation of treaty rights. Continuing education credits will be available for educators.

We are thankful for the vision of Ojibwe leaders who carefully preserved the rights to hunt, fish and gather in territories ceded to the United States government in a series of treaties. Their wisdom succeeded in providing the continued opportunity for tribal members to harvest from the lakes and land throughout the ceded territories in northern Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota.
