INTERNSHIP ANNOUNCEMENT

POSITION:

Environmental Field Technician (1)

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Dates of employment: June 1, 2026 – August 7, 2026

(10 weeks/400 hours total) Rate of pay: \$15.00 per hour

Dates may change at discretion of supervisor and intern availability

SUPERVISION:

Treaty Resource Specialist, Dawn White (or designee)

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Primary duties will be to assist the Treaty Resource Specialist with various tasks both in the office and in the field. Person will be required to perform the following tasks:

- 1) Assist with monitoring water quality in ceded territory manoomin (wild rice) lakes, rivers, and flowages.
- 2) Will help drive, load/unload gear, and portage to-and-from manoomin sites. The ability to portage canoe in sometimes steep and rough terrain and paddle approximately 2-20 miles per week in most weather conditions is required.
- 3) Gather and process water samples, operate water quality monitoring equipment, and collect physical and biological information.
- 4) Work will be 30-40 hours per week which may include working up to 3 consecutive days per week. This position may involve some overnight motel stays and camping overnight in rustic conditions. Intern will need to provide their own camping gear.
- 5) Other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Ability to perform field work and record results in an efficient, accurate, and neat manner under the supervision of the Treaty Resource Specialist.
- Must be able to work under occasional adverse environmental conditions including heat, rain, etc.
- Outdoors and overnight camping experience required.
- Must be in good physical condition and be willing to travel overnight and/or out of state for consecutive days.
- Must have a valid drivers' license and be insurable under GLIFWC policies.
- Native American preference, but all qualified applicants will be considered consistent with GLIFWC policies.
- Preference given to persons with previous GLIFWC employment/internship experience.
